# Personal Career Highlights and Values Identification

This ministry grew out of the belief that while the presenting problem might be food insecurity, the larger issue is the common need for community. The culture of "Break Bread" does not allow for anyone to stand above another, but fosters mutuality, respect and community for all.

This highlights the value I place on our global connections, on opportunities to broaden of our understanding of different cultures, peoples and histories, and on developing relationships of reciprocity.
