**Oscar Teodoro Eusebio** was born on November 4, 1929 in Pasig City, the Philippines, to Eulogio and Magdalena Eusebio. During his childhood days he was very fond of playing in the rice fields and hunting wild animals.

Growing up he took up engineering as requested by his tatay (dad). While studying engineering at Feati University he met Felisa, a student at Philippine Normal College, which is just across the street from Feati University. They decided to get married and had four children: Oscar Jr. (deceased), Miriam, Jimmy and Ruth.



In his heart Oscar had always wanted to be a lawyer. After getting married he went back to school, taking up law in Manila Law College. He earned his diploma, eventually passed the board exams with one of the top scores, and proudly became known as Atty. Oscar T. Eusebio.

As a lawyer he worked as a personnel officer in the Land Registration Commission, and was promoted to Register of Deeds in the province of Rizal.

During the period of Martial Law in the Philippines (1972-1981), he was ordered to sign some

paperwork by the regime. He refused, but that event was behind his decison to emigrate to the USA, where he found peace and better life. Oscar was able to work in the Juvenile Court in San Diego until his retirement. He worked very hard to give his family a good life.
