Year-End Lead Pastor Report for Charge Conference 2022 Rev. Trudy D. Robinson

What a strange time to be in ministry!

Strange because...

- 1. We are coming out of a pandemic and things are not going back to the way they were;
- The Church and its relationship to a changing culture is more pronounced as we come out of a pandemic;
- 3. No one has any solid answers for what changes are necessary to create space for the church to adapt and function in this changing culture;
- 4. The changes are needing to have happened yesterday, as people's engagement with the Church has been changing long before the pandemic, as has the sustainability of Churches' operating budgets.

Five Points of Vision

Nevertheless, we recognized opportunities during the pandemic that First Church continues to lean into. We call them our five points of vision.

- As the church was tiptoeing out of the pandemic and heading towards more in person gatherings, we made dinner reservations and plans to hike all around San Diego as part of the strategy for gathering neighbors and people with similar interests into small groups. These events have created connections where there were none. This will continue to be a focus in the coming years as we develop ways to empower people to be disciples where they live.
- 2. The church affirms its commitment to racial justice through the Endowment that raises our awareness, increases our involvement, and amplifies the voices of nonprofit organizations working to combat racism and provide direct services to people of color in the San Diego region. We continue to do the work of dismantling racism within our hearts and our institution.
- 3. Our conversations around Affordable Housing continued this year as we have been exploring a land lease to allow Habitat for Humanity to develop and manage our property in Ocean Beach. We've learned just recently that this will not work as presently discussed. So we will continue to explore possibilities. We see the need in Ocean Beach and our desire is to be faithful to God's call to serve the community.
- 4. The Dream School of the Arts made progress at a much slower pace than we had hoped, as the construction and remodeling of the building was deterred due to the high demand of contractors. But the dream is alive, as conversations are happening within our congregation and with local school principles. Excitement grows as possibilities are being made concrete.
- 5. As some people returned to worship regularly in the physical sanctuary on Sunday morning, we continue to have many more watching the service online. As we sought to reach a greater online audience with an abbreviated service we called "Variations", we discovered we were not reaching anyone beyond those already connected to the church. We realized we needed to know more about the digital world and how to analyze and adjust our efforts. We shifted direction with this point of vision and entered into a new relationship to help us with this.

Staffing and Administration

Our Director of Communications retired in June allowing space for us to revision the church's communications for the 21st century. We worked with consultant Damian Geddry and hired Puzzle Pieces Marketing Company to help us strategize to create an online presence that will reach a broader, more diverse audience with an intentionally focused identity. We are only a few months into this strategy but the way in which it already has our staff and ministry leaders

thinking beyond the walls of the church to communicate with the larger community is remarkable.

In the Spring, we welcomed Brian Lustig as our Director of Choral Activities and Dana Zimbric as the Director of Children's Music Ministries. With this new staff, Director of Music Ministries Dr. Jaebon Hwang is bringing a new repertoire, greater quality, and renewed interest to all our choirs.

In September, we welcomed Rev. Brittany J. Hanlin as the Teaching Pastor at Water's Edge Faith Community. The transition has not been easy as the congregation needed to let go of a beloved pastor and receive someone's who's gifts and leadership style are different. Rev. Brittany has a brilliant mind, a love for God, and a heart for the Gospel of Jesus. We are blessed by her leadership.

We are blessed with many people who have named the church in their estate plans. We are grieving the loss of wonderful members this last year, as we do every year. The legacy of these Covenant Circle members has enabled us to do many things beyond what our operating budget can afford. We are lucky. Part of our work in the coming year will be to explore the tension between the lacking sustainability of our operating budget and the abundance in our undesignated funds in the Foundation, with the explicit focus on asking if we are investing the foundation funds in what is needed for the church of the future. This will involve some significant study and conversation about the changing culture, the church's mission, and the kind of adaptability that is needed. The study and conversation will be the foundation for some imaginative and creative exploration of new ways of being the church in today's world. We expect the process will produce a forward-thinking plan for staffing and funding our mission and ministries.

The Changing Church

This is a strange time to be in ministry. But I find it to be very exciting time because I believe in God who reconfigures life after the trauma of death. I believe God is active in our world doing something new, and we can trust in God as we learn from others. I also believe people at First Church believe these things as well.

Rev. Trudy D. Robinson

Report for Charge Conference 2022 Rev. Dr. Hannah Ka, Pastor of Discipleship

The third year is the charm. I met wonderful people during my first year (2020-2021). We've connected meaningfully through my second year (2021-2022). And God is doing amazing things through us in my third appointment year with First Church.

Each year, my goal was and will continue to be the same—connecting members and friends in **small group** settings, empowering folks to care for one another and to live out their faith in their day-today life, equipping our disciples to step up into the leadership, and thus igniting deeper relationship with God as well.

The outcome of this year's ministry exceeded my expectation. Some of the people I met through neighborhood gatherings, walks, book studies, and other events organically stepped up to be the organizers. These leaders are turning our occasional gatherings into regular small groups: **neighborhood groups and small groups by interests and age-demographics**. What's fascinating about these small groups is that each group has evolved and continues to develop further as they meet, with a growing sense of identity and purpose.

Existing small groups by mission and outreach are well established with solid leadership and years of experience. Their excellent work makes First Church known to the world. It brings me joy when leaders of these groups reach out to me for consultation and theological insights as they adapt to the new and changing reality.

Four **quarterly church-wide gatherings** are planned, with different themes, to weave together off all these small group efforts. The next one is scheduled on January 15 to renew our baptismal vow to live out our faith in our daily life.

First Church had a great number of **visitors** this year, a few each Sunday. Our Hospitality and Front Office Coordinator, Pam Hanson, and Director of Member Care Ministry, Demmie Divine made a great team to organize worship volunteers, welcome and follow up with new visitors both in-person and online, and to move our repeating visitors toward **membership**. Expanding the online and in-person **new membership classes**, I plan to launch some **online small groups** and **newer small groups**.

Welcoming new members through **baptism** was humbling experience for me. I had the privilege of tag teaming with Rev. Trudy and the joy of meeting with every candidate and their parents in the case of children for baptism.

I take every encounter, whatever form it may be, as an opportunity for **discipleship**. In each conversation, I listen, provide pastoral care, offer a bit of teaching and provide organic leadership training in the context of 1-on-1 meeings, small groups, mission and outreach, and service projects.

This year, I was invited to **preach and teach** quite often outside my usual contexts stated above. It was not an easy stretch, but I enjoyed new learnings from each preparation. Rev. Trudy made herself available for brainstorming and consultation, and showered me with her words of affirmation throughout the year. I did not see it then, but in retrospect, I now see her intentional discipleship to nurture the next generation of leaders.

I will continue to do the same thing in all my discipleship efforts, making myself available for conversations with my friends and leaders. Now, my invitation is open to you all, my friends and trusted leaders, to join me in **building a deeper relationship with God and each other**. Let's **follow Jesus** and be joyful each day!

Report to the 2022 Church Conference

Rev. Tamara Walker, Pastor of Congregational Care

Pastoral Care is my passion. This position suits me beautifully and I am so grateful to be here. My deepest calling, I believe is to hospice care and pastoral care. I am a hospice chaplain. It was my privilege for 10 years to embrace this role. In this new position, as Pastor of Congregational Care I have expanded my understanding of and ability to care for multiple people with multiple needs. It has been an experience of learning how to manage and work with committees and groups committed to caring. I have a group of Stephen Leaders, a Caring Hearts Group who together care for our shut-ins, a prayer group that prays for the whole church and that enables me to know and triage more needs in this large congregation. I oversee a Prayers and Squares ministry that offers prayer quilts to anyone in need of prayer. I would prefer to stay in this roleand pastoral care work is where I am most suited and where I thrive.

I have learned that it is difficult to get to know a large church. Pastoral care is not just care of the community of faith but for the individual. It has taken me four years to get to know this church and the people. (Covid was not kind in this regard and face to face time was lost but not connection.) It also takes time to earn the trust of the congregation and I sense that the many seeds that have been planted through the last four years are yielding a beautiful harvest of caring. Our congregation is growing in caring for one another. Spiritual growth and a genuine desire to grow in faith and in faithful action is alive and abuzz in our congregation. It seems to me that my work here should continue while there is momentum and trust. It would be difficult for someone to come in and start fresh. This church has had a great deal of change in the last 6 years and the healing of rifts and distrust are evident. There was a spirit of fear, sorrow and uncertainty about pastoral leadership and grief from loss of trust and hope, when I arrived. Healing is happening now and I would like to see it strengthen and grow. I would like to lay good groundwork and preparation of lay leaders, in the area of pastoral care so that the pastor who follows me can continue the care and not have to reinvent the process. Much is lost in that time.

Funerals, Memorials and the follow up grief work is another piece of my pastoral care in this congregation. I have officiated many services for our congregation members, their families and San Diego community families. We have a Memorial Garden on our campus and many of our members choose to be interned here, near the sanctuary garden that they viewed throughout their faith journey with us. We follow up our services with grief support in the form of calls, cards, four resources over the course of the first year of bereavement about grief and affirming their own process through it. We provide three grief support groups each year, two in person-Spring/Fall and one on-line - Summer. Our Fall group this year included 8 of our church folk. We have 5-12 each session.

We initiated a support group that meets monthly for the Caregivers of people living with Alzheimer's. This stemmed from a three meeting presentation that we offered about

Alzheimer's and Dementia. We learned a great deal about the disease, but also that far more people are facing this and caregiving now than we were aware. We tried an Art Therapy group for kids in grief and a Youth in grief support group but it was not readily attended, these youth received continued support through our New Life Counselling Center. We know the need is there and will try again this next year. We will also be initiating support groups for folk Living with Cancer, Auto Immune and Chronic Pain, Living with Divorce for Adults and Kids and continue to offer sessions to help our community Normalize Living with Mental Illness and other disabilities.

Church Conference 2022 **Rev. Brittany Juliette Hanlin, Teaching Pastor**

I have been serving as a pastor at First UMC since September 1, 2022. Serving as the Teaching Pastor to the Water's Edge Faith Community over the last two months has sharpened my both my ministerial and leadership skills. I am still very new to the FUMC community and my report will reflect my limited time in leadership. I look forward to growing with the congregation as we journey together.

The Affordable Housing Project in Ocean Beach is still a dream of our community, however we've had a setback in our development. Due to the space (number of units) and height restrictions for building, Habitat for Humanity recently notified us that the cost of living would be too high and unsustainable for low-income families to maintain. This news is disappointing, but the Affordable Housing committee will reconvene to explore alternative solutions.

Water's Edge partnered with the **OB Food Bank** this month to host a hot lunch of grilled cheese sandwiches and soup for our neighbors in the community. This is an opportunity for the church to deepen our community connections while meeting some the of immediate needs of our neighbors in need. We are patronizing a local restaurant in Ocean Beach for the sandwiches called, Mad Munch Grilled Cheezer Company. By working with local businesses and organizations we begin to strengthen our relationships in the community.

Each week I meet with the **Water's Edge Care Team** to discuss the needs of our congregants. During these meetings I learn about the congregation as whole, while also learning the pastoral needs of individual congregants. This team has been an integral part in keeping me abreast of needs as I continue to cultivate relationships.

Leading **worship** each Sunday continues to expand my theology and my preaching practice by deepening my relationships with members of the congregation. As we move into the season of Advent, we prepare ourselves to the newness of life that Christ brings. We are in the process of hiring an **Interim Music Director** to begin in the new year. I have been working with members of the PPRC ensure a good working process and an agreeable solution. It is my prayer for the Water's Edge congregation to continue to open ourselves to the new and good thing God is doing in our midst.
